#### Executive Director's Statement

I am pleased to present PHM's annual report. This edition was delayed because the museum changed its fiscal year to match the calendar year; hence, this report provides material about the museum from June 2008 through December 2009.

This time period saw two great exhibits draw visitors from near and far—the Lewisburg history exhibit and the Pennsylvania quilts exhibit. Other programs and exhibits were equally well-received throughout those months.

A cursory look at the museum's income and expenses shows that there was a net profit. However, without financial assistance from the Friends of PHM, the museum would have been more than \$60,000 in debt. The state budget mess did indeed have a negative impact on museum funding. The PA Historical and Museum Commission had its budget drastically cut, forcing it to curtail many grants, and operational support grants were severely cut. The recession also had an impact on

charitable giving. This, coupled with increased utility bills, means difficult times for many non-profits.

Thanks to Craig Harley, the Friends of PHM has become the primary fundraising vehicle for the museum. The Friends are assuming control of most of the museum's fundraising events in hopes of implementing a unified plan that will bring in additional funds.

The museum will survive these tough times and emerge stronger than ever. Planning is underway for future exhibits and programs, and we continue to attract new members and groups wishing to use our facilities. Cooperative ventures with the Union County Historical Society bode well for even more outside cooperation with programs and exhibits. We appreciate your support and hope to see you in 2010.

## **THE YEAR IN REVIEW, June 2008-December 2009**

The past year at Packwood House Museum saw two very fine exhibits that brought many new visitors through the doors. "On Market Street and Around the Corner: 200 years of Lewisburg History," was a cooperative venture between the museum and the Union County Historical Society. Running from June to October 2008, this fascinating look at the history of Lewisburg was highly successful and earned high plaudits from many residents who learned quite a bit about the town's past.

"Pennsylvania Quilts: Studies in Color" ran from June to October 2009 and set a record for attendance for any exhibit offered by PHM. More than 1,500 visitors from the United States and around the world came to Lewisburg to see this stunning visual array of more than 80 quilts in both the Kelly Gallery and the museum building. The special Quilt Weekend in August drew an audience of quilt enthusiasts and garnered rave reviews. In addition, the Piecemakers Quilt Guild of the Susquehanna Valley reproduced two quilts from the museum collection. These re-

productions were raffled off at the October member dinner.

The "Pennsylvania's Museum Extension Project" exhibit was featured on Channel 16 when Mike Stevens came to see it as part of his "On the Pennsylvania Road" series. This exhibit featured the museum's extensive collection of architectural models, puppets, and dioramas crafted during the Depression to provide supplemental teaching materials for public schools across the commonwealth.

Most of the museum's programs were equally well-attended. Mike McWilliams' slide lecture on the Pennsylvania Canal drew 100 people, as did Kevin Tersavage's program on ghosts, based on local investigations by the Central Pennsylvania Paranormal Research Association. Thanks to grants from the local chapter of the PA Partners in the Arts, the museum has offered a series of free summer programs for kids, which have been well-attended. The usual art exhibits and shows, including the annual Scholastic Arts exhibit, all have received their share of visitors.

Of equal interest has been the information unearthed during the ongoing archives work at the museum. Thanks to a \$5,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities, we were able to purchase acid-free archival boxes, folders, and associated material to begin work on the museum's extensive archival collections, primarily the Fetherston Family Papers. The cedar closet off the library was turned into the archives room and since the spring of 2007, volunteers and interns have been working to sort and file this important collection. We have unearthed all of Edith's genealogical research, John's papers that span his entire professional career, as well as bank records, incoming correspondence, financial ledgers, and other material that bring to life the Fetherstons and their careers. We hope to finish this work in 2010.

The past year saw a change in the annual Champagne & Orchids Dinner. The museum formed a partnership with the Hospitality Program at the Pennsylvania College of Technology in Williamsport. Chef Mike Ditchfield and his catering class cooked and served the 2009 dinner, which proved to be a big hit with the 8 fortunate diners that evening. The class will be back again in 2010 with another wonderful menu.

During the past year, Peggy Shields was contracted to improve the museum's website, which has resulted in a more attractive presentation, as well as making it easier for staff to make changes and updates.

Thanks to the generosity of the Trustees, the retaining wall along Cherry Alley was demolished and rebuilt by Hearthstone Masonry. The old brick wall was leaning toward the alley and fell completely as work

began on it this past fall. The new wall is well-built and will last for decades.

In order to help save money, the museum switched its telephone service from D&E Communications to Service Electric, along with its computer/internet service. Pest control is now handled by Entoguard rather than Ehrlich. Our natural gas is handled by UGI instead of PPL.

One of the major processes at the museum over the past year has been the enhanced role of the Friends of Packwood House Museum in raising funds for the museum. Thanks to a matching grant from the Degenstein Foundation, the museum hired local consultant Craig Harley to examine the museum's fundraising techniques and suggest a new plan. Craig was hired for a year, June 2008-May 2009. During that time, he came to the conclusion that the Friends would be the best fundraising mechanism for the museum. In the fall of 2009, the Friends took over the Annual Appeal mailing. In 2010, the Friends will take control of most of the museum's fundraisers, including the Attic Tag Sale, Champagne & Orchids Dinner, Annual Member Dinner, and other events, including perhaps some new ones.

As of this writing, projects in progress include a pictorial history of Lewisburg in collaboration with the Union County Historical Society; the book will be published later in 2010 by Arcadia Press. The museum will also announce the publication of a DVD featuring the 2009 quilt exhibit. This video should be finished sometime in the spring of 2010.
